Impact stories from our community

Filling the gaps when services have been shut down and access to care is uncertain

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Hope House of the Shenandoah, rapid-rehousing program

- Provided over **\$90,000** in financial assistance including rent and utility fees, and emergency shelter
- **9** clients are ending the year in permanent housing
- **5** clients are in stable emergency shelter and in active housing search

Community Health program

- Hosted **12** monthly Community Health Clinics in partnership with Augusta Health, serving **~130** individuals
- **2,854** safer sex items distributed: external/internal condoms, HIV at-home kits, dental dams
- Partnered with Virginia Department of Health, Central Shenandoah Health District, JMU Nursing, ARROW Project to provide health education and outreach

Staunton Pride - “We Belong Here”

- Our largest event to date, we collaborated with **90** partners, **20** performers
- An estimated **5,000** people in total attendance!



New this year!

- **Community Kitchen:** We upgraded our kitchen to increase our capacity to serve our community.
 - We hosted cooking classes, **6** potluck events serving **193** people, and established a regular community cook event called Souper Sundays.
- **Expansion of partner-led programs:** including skill-share events, book club, workshops, and trainings

Friendly City Safe Space, Harrisonburg location

- Under new direction by Dandy Knopf, FCSS saw a highly visible year focused on **community building** and **visibility**
- Overhaul of the physical space, including expansion of computer resources, education, and mutual aid supplies available for the community
