PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Free Resources provided this year:

books available from our **Queer Resource Libraries**

of new gender-affirming materials, including binders, given from our Trans Health Fund

dozens of articles of clothing from our Clothes Closet

Hope House of the Shenandoah

- Served 44 individuals with 23 folks finding permanent and stable housing
- Connected each client to other supportive services, Center programs and resources, as well as hygiene, cleaning and household items.

Community Health Worker

- Provided support to 25 clients with program services, education, or referrals
- Accompanied clients on 66 healthcare appointments in support and advocacy
- Implemented a direct referral line from Augusta Health's electronic medical records system and the Shenandoah LGBTQ Center

Health and Wellness Fairs

- Hosted 4 community health and wellness events, using a lens of health equity
- Provided 74 free vaccinations to community members in partnership with CSHD
- Partnered with 30 community partners to provide services and resources

Friendly City Safe Space, Harrisonburg location

- Published *Out in the Valley*, the first collection of personal narratives from LGBTQ+ members in the Shenandoah Valley
- Hired a Racial Equity Coordinator to help guide equity-focused strategic planning
- In only one year of operation, built a cohort of **70** volunteers that support drop-in hours and plan and host events
